4. Prize Distribution.





The Deputy Conservator of Forest, State Forest Department, Ahmedabad took keen interest in organizing the same.

BOOK REVIEW

Review of "Highlights of the Space Age" – Author: Dr. P. N. Pathak (PRISM Books Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore- 2006, pp 169, Rs. 240/-, ISBN: 81-7286-504-X) by Satyendra M. Bhandari.

As we approach the Golden Jubilee of the advent of Space Age on Oct. 4, 2007, there is bound to be an upsurge in the interest about the innumerable achievements in the area of space science and technology. Indeed, we have come a long way from the days of small rockets and early satellite based experiments to advanced satellite systems and space stations and deep space probes that provide near operational services in the area of detailed monitoring of the Earth and its environment, including the weather, providing efficient communication and navigation capability, and of course probing and discovering the objects within the solar system and the Universe beyond. Man made objects have traveled far and wide in the Solar System and man himself has constructed a viable home in orbit around the Earth. It has been an exciting and wonderful journey indeed, revolutionizing the way we work and live and perceive our existence in the Universe.

In bringing the excitement of space to the general reader, Dr. Pathak, author of the newly brought out book "Highlights of the Space Age" has taken the lead. The book presents a highly readable account of the developments in areas of space science, space technology and space applications. Being directly associated himself with development of space activities in the country since inception, he has been able to provide a ring-side close-up view of all the aspects of space research. The book also separately chronicles, in brief, the space related developments in India from the very initial stages to the present.

It is a remarkable book describing the development of various aspects of space science and technology. The book is written in a simple, smooth, sincere, systematic and scientific style. The author has a tremendous -

capacity to express scientific concepts and ideas in carefully crafted language without taking recourse to any mathematical formulas or expressions. In less than 200 pages, the author has covered each and every aspect of space age developments, with nuggets of information scattered everywhere. He has terrific control on the narration.

What the preface says "topics are introduced in a logical manner, so that the reader can get a good picture of the whole subject. The language and the style of presentation are simple and descriptive, so that students at higher secondary level can understand the content without much difficulty", is indeed the case.

The book, a welcome addition to the literature on popular science books in India, is highly readable and a must for anyone interested in a fleeting overview of the the development of Space Science and Technology and how it contributes to our knowledge about the Earth, the Solar System and the Universe at large. Coming as it does on during the 50th year of the advent of Space Age, this celebrates the Golden Jubilee of Space age quite appropriately.

The author, as well as the Publisher, deserves hearty congratulations on their effort in bringing out the book in a timely manner and in a size and binding that is very convenient to hold and read. It is also priced reasonably.

It is hoped that other scientists in India are inspired to put down their knowledge and experience in the subject of their expertise for the benefit of general public.

The 23rd AGM was organized on May 04, 2007 at SAC, Ahmedabad. Around 52 members attended the meeting. AGM started with welcome remarks from Shri S.S. Rana, Chairman, ISRS-AC. He remarked that ISRS-AC continues to be the largest and most active Chapter. He briefly mentioned about some of the significant activities carried out by ISRS-AC during the year 2006-2007. He informed that during the year 2006-2007 activities of the Chapter were organized jointly with the active participation and support of Gujarat State Forest Department, Van Chetna Kendra & Forestry Information Centre, Bodakdev, Minnie CAMA Secondary and Higher Secondary School for the Blind, Blind People's Association, Ahmedabad, M.G. Science College, Gujarat University, Institute of Technology, Nirma University, Sardar Sarovar Narmada Nigam Limited, Scientific Societies (ISG-AC, IMSA, INCA-GB), ISRS-HQ, ISPRS-Commission-IV and SAC. He announced that the proposal submitted by ISRS-AC to Main body to organize a National Symposium on a tentative topic "Advances in **Remote Sensing Technology and Applications** with Special Emphasis on Microwave Remote Sensing", during Nov.-Dec., 2008 with Space Applications Centre, Ahmedabad as host on the occasion of the silver jubilee of the Ahmedabad chapter has been accepted.

After the opening remarks, the items as per agenda circulated were taken up one by one.

1. Dr. A.S. Rajawat, Secretary, ISRS-AC informed the House about the 22nd AGM Minutes and the House approved the 22nd AGM Minutes by voice vote.

- 2. The 23rd Annual Report was presented by Secretary, ISRS-AC about the activities taken up during the year 2006-07. It was informed that during the year 2006-07 all mandatory as well other planned activities were organized. The details of the activities grouped as follows were presented:

- Chapter management activities such as ISRS-AC EC meetings and ISRS-AC Accounts and Audit.
- 3. Shri N.S. Mehta, Treasurer presented the audited account of FY 2005-2006 as well as FY 2006-2007. After some clarifications House passed the Audit Reports 2005-2006 as well 2006-07 by voice vote.

Following points emerged out of discussions on activities for 2006-07 as well as planned activities for the year 2007-2008:

- The getup as well as contents of this Newsletter was well appreciated. It was also suggested that efforts should be made towards transforming it to a National Newsletter. It was suggested that the soft copy of the Newsletter should be circulated.
